# SEPTEMBER FIELD TRIP REPORT - HOLMES JUNGLE (RUSSELL DEMPSTER)

We met in the top car park overlooking Holmes Jungle for the September field trip as the track-laying for the Alice Springs to Darwin railway was nearing completion at Berrimah. A hardy Canarium australianum was fruiting in the centre of the car park. Aboriginal uses of this species were many and varied. They included the seeds being eaten and the wood being used to made canoes and pipes, while the bark was prepared for a variety of medicinal purposes.

At the bottom car park near the entrance to the jungle itself, Terminalia grandiflora was flowering profusely. These slender trees have deeply fissured grey trunks and pendulous branchlets. The creamy-green flowers are much larger than the flowers of all other Australian Terminalias.

At the entrance to the jungle a strong, sweet fragrance pervaded the area. Termialia microcarpa was responsible (formerly Terminalia sericocarpa). These deciduous Terminalias form magnificent stately specimens with deeply fissured black trunks, and they are common in monsoon forest associated with permanent fresh water. Termialia microcarpa has sympodial branching, that is, the new branchlets come out from underneath.

The yellow trunks of Calophyllum soulattri featured inside the enclosed canopy. This species, like the other Calophllums, has fine parallel veins on its leaves. The rounded, narrow oval leaves, as well as the yellow trunk on mature specimens, distinguish Calophyllum soulattri from Calophyllum sil and Calophyllum inophyllum, and in Australia Calophyllum soulattri is restricted to the Nortern Territory.

Other species which feature at Holmes Jungle include Acacia auriculiformis (Black Wattle), Barringtonia acutangula, Carallia brachiata, Carpentaria acuminata, Ficus hispida, Ficus racemosa (Cluster Fig), Glycosmis trifoliata, Horsefieldia australiana, Melaleuca species, Melicope elleryana (formerly Euodia elleryana), Sterculia holtzei and Vavaea australiana. Some Mango trees were also in evidence, left over from Mr. Holmes' occupation of the area.

Overall we all enjoyed a pleasant leach free morning walk.
